Stafford Mixer Club meet once a week on a Tuesday afternoon, providing a lifeline for older people that are often isolated except for this one day a

week where they can meet and socialise. The average age of attendees is between 70-90; many of the members are hard of hearing, some have dementia, and others are struggling with social isolation and loneliness.



How did you spend your day?

I spent the day helping out at the Tuesday mixer club Christmas party. I made six Christmas hampers to donate as raffle prizes, each filled with a bottle of wine, nice tea and coffee, chocolates, jams and other goodies.

I also helped the members to get involved with various activities happening on the day including; a Christmas jumper competition, and table decorating competition! Everyone had a really great time!

I had a lovely day helping out. I was really touched to see how many older people look forward to their Tuesday afternoon at the club, as it can be very lonely and isolating for them during the rest of the week.
